

## REPORT FROM MOUNTFIELD PCC – ALL SAINTS CHURCH

The Church is well maintained and issues dealt with as they arise.

Ongoing maintenance work continues throughout the year.

We have done work on gutter repairs last year which has sorted out an ongoing damp problem on one of the internal walls.

Chris Holden is managing a wild flower area of the churchyard.

We all on the PCC miss Nick whose support, hard work and dedication to the church was invaluable.

For the last 2 years we have had services on the 1st and 3rd Sunday taken by Jeremy Sykes or Ellie Mackay.

The congregation varies from 12 - 20 throughout most of the year.

On Remembrance Day and Christmas Day we take the service ourselves, and at Christmas there are over 60 in the congregation.

The arrangement with Reverend Jeremy Sykes finishes at the end of May, Mountfield Church enters into an interregnum period, along with Brightling and Netherfield, and we have to arrange clergy for services for the foreseeable future.

It is the PCCs intention to continue to arrange for services to be held on the 1st and 3rd of each month.

Jackie Spriggs was awarded the Order of St Richard at Chichester Cathedral in September for her support and commitment to ALL Saints for over 60 years.
